Program Educational Objectives (PEOs)

The faculty members of the Faculty of Law have established the Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs) for the LL.M. programme. These objectives are overarching statements that outline the anticipated career and professional milestones that the programme aims to equip its graduates to attain within a few years after earning their degree. The PEOs for the Master of Laws (LL.M.) programme are as follows:

- 1. Critical Thinking:** Develop the ability to critically analyse legal issues in chosen specializations, leading to successful careers.
- 2. Research Skills:** Enhance research capabilities, preparing graduates for doctoral studies.
- 3. Teaching Competence:** Prepare graduates to contribute to society through effective teaching roles.
- 4. Legal Expertise:** Equip graduates with advanced legal insights, providing an edge over ordinary law graduates in judicial professions.
- 5. Leadership and Ethics:** Cultivate leadership skills with integrity, enabling graduates to function professionally in multidisciplinary teams with a positive attitude.

Program Outcomes (POs)

Programme Outcomes (POs) represent the key competencies and attributes that graduates of the LL.M. programme are expected to possess, demonstrating their preparedness to function effectively as legal professionals after completing the degree. These outcomes define the specific knowledge, skills, and capabilities that students are expected to have acquired by the time of graduation. Each outcome reflects the critical areas of learning that contribute to the

student's professional growth. The successful achievement of all Programme Outcomes ensures that graduates are well-equipped to meet the Programme Educational Objectives in the future.

The following 10 POs have been identified, and the LL.M. curriculum at TU has been carefully structured to fully address and support the attainment of these outcomes.

- 1. Independent Research:** Conduct independent research on diverse legal topics using primary and secondary data.
- 2. Analytical Skills:** Interpret judgments of domestic and international courts and re-interpret opinions of jurists and academicians.
- 3. Problem Solving:** Demonstrate understanding of substantive and procedural aspects of chosen specializations, offering solutions based on such understanding.
- 4. Research Writing:** Independently write research articles and undertake studies on various legal topics.
- 5. Social Responsibility:** Develop a sense of social responsibility and commitment, addressing various socio-legal issues.
- 6. Professional Competence:** Establish as competent professionals in a highly competitive world with cutting-edge legal education tools.
- 7. Higher Education Preparation:** Apply diverse knowledge to prepare for higher research degrees with clarity of purpose.
- 8. Critical Thinking:** Translate complex legal ideas into practical, actionable solutions by applying analytical reasoning and evaluative skills. Develop the ability to assess legal issues critically and devise innovative approaches grounded in legal theory.
- 9. Ethical Practice:** Demonstrate unwavering commitment to ethical principles by upholding professional integrity, accountability, and responsibility in all legal practices and decision-making processes.
- 10. Effective Communication:** Communicate effectively on complex legal activities with the legal community and society at large.

Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs)

The Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) are specific statements that describe what graduates are expected to learn, and be able to perform in a specialised area of discipline, upon graduation from a programme. The PSOs of Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) programme are as follows:
